We thank you for your support with this and wish your child all the very best for their learning in 2017.

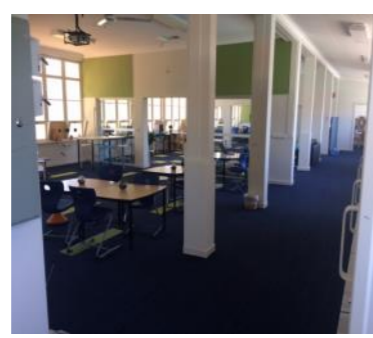

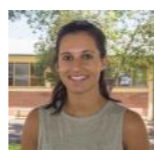

School Dress Code Policy

Respect ~ Honesty ~ Community

It is an expectation that all students enrolled at Elizabeth Grove School wear full dress code.

Clothing in line with the dress code should be worn at all times.

Students are clearly identifiable as members of this school community by:-

- Wearing of the school dress code as it reinforces school pride, respect and positive relationships.
- Allowing us to identify students and ensure a safe school environment that deters intruders.
- Having a practical and affordable dress code that maintains modesty, and enables students to participate in sporting activities.

The dress code is endorsed by the Elizabeth Grove Governing Council and complies with the regulations and guidelines set out by the DECD.

Tops and Jumpers:	EGPS Logo Tops/Jumpers/Jackets Bottle Green or Yellow Gold Polo Shirts/Windcheaters
Under Shirts:	Green , yellow or black; (if they can be seen)
Shorts or Pants (Girls and Boys):	Black – no shorter than mid-thigh
Uniform (Girls):	Green and White Check dresses
Skirts (Girls):	Black only – skirts must have black bike shorts or sports briefs underneath as P.E and sports are a part of the curriculum.
Hats:	Legionnaire's style hats are supplied by the school and must be worn when outdoors in accordance with the sun safety policy. (Hats are given to the children on entry to the school and in Year 4. They must not be defaced or destroyed in any way. Parents and Caregivers will be asked to replace defamed or damaged hats.
Jewellery:	Studs and Sleeper earrings/ Medical Alert Bracelets are permitted Watches are permitted No other jewellery is to be worn for safety reasons.
Makeup:	Makeup is not appropriate, nor allowed to be worn at school.
Hair Accessories:	Black, Green or Yellow EGPS recommend that hair that is longer than shoulder length should be tied back for health and safety reasons.
Shoes/Footwear:	Sneakers or School Shoes should be worn at all times.
Exceptions on Medical Grounds: If your child is required to wear an object which is not included in the dress code for medical reasons, an exception may be given with written permission from the principal of the school.	

- School clothing is available from department stores or can be ordered from the Front Office.
- Payment plans are available please ask at Front Office. Clothing not given until full payment has been made.
- Any clothing or accessories worn, which are deemed inappropriate may be required to be removed or changed to dress code.
