English

Genre Writing: Narrative.

Year 2: Understand that different types of texts have identifiable text structures and language features that help the text serve its purpose.

Understand that simple connections can be made between ideas by using a compound sentence with two or more clauses usually linked by a coordinating conjunction.

Understand the use of vocabulary about familiar and new topics and experiment with and begin to make conscious choices of vocabulary to suit audience and purpose.

Year 3: Understand how different types of texts vary in use of language choices, depending on their purpose and context.

Understand that a clause is a unit of grammar usually containing a subject and a verb and that these need to be in agreement.

Learn extended and technical vocabulary and ways of expressing opinion including modal verbs and adverbs.

Spelling and Grammar

Year 2/3: Words Their Way- digraphs, long vowels, blends, silent letters, irregular words, prefixes, suffixes, morphemes and less common letter combinations.

Grammar procedure-noun groups, verbs and commands, joining words, groups of words giving detail about how, when, where and why.

Use of dictionaries to further word meaning.
